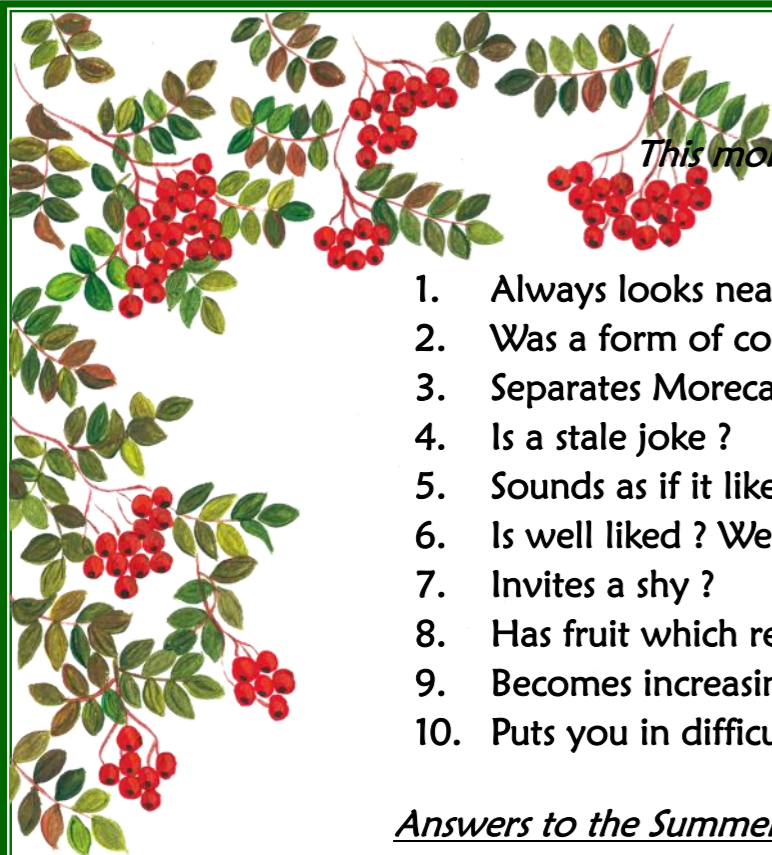

Letter from The Curate

Dear friends,

In Autumn is a second spring when every leaf is a flower *(Albert Camus)*

If you're familiar with my carrot-top appearance, it's not hard to imagine that I feel 'at home' in this season surrounded by the orange, red, yellow and brown hues of the autumnal leaves. Autumn is most definitely my favourite season (although they're all pretty splendid in their own ways), but not just because of the colours. I love the sense of freshness that the crisper air brings which chimes in with the fresh start of the academic year. Whether your year revolves around school terms or not, there is a cultural sense of a new year or new beginning come September.

With a new year tends to come a time to review and re-evaluate. Sometimes it's a case of 'out with the old and in with the new' as we look to re-prioritise and organise. Along with a house tidy, a wardrobe overhaul, a new set of stationery (you know who you are!), or a new hobby or habit perhaps, a fresh start might also look like seeking forgiveness for that which has gone before. Forgiveness is at the heart of the Christian faith, and is an ongoing offering from God. The writer of the book of Lamentations declares that:

The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning. (Lam. 3.22-23)

Merciful forgiveness is available to us each and every day. No matter what we do, say or think that we might regret or know to be less than what God might want for us, the slate can be wiped clean and we can start afresh when we turn back to God to say sorry. It's like one of those old camera films (remember those, before the digital world took over?!) – all the photographed goings on were held in those small, dark negatives... but, once exposed to the light, that was it – they were gone. God's forgiveness is like that – we can share with him what we're not proud of. When we bring these things into his light, his mercy wipes the slate clean leaving us to start over afresh.

Ironically, Albert Camus, from whom came the beautiful headline quote, was known for his contribution to the philosophical rise of absurdism, which – according to Wikipedia – is "the philosophical theory that the universe is irrational and meaningless". Personally, I find much meaning in his words at the head of this letter... meaning in the beauty of creation, a meaning that tells us that each season has a majesty of its own, and a deeper meaning about the one who brought it all into being in the first place – the Creator of this very meaningful universe!

And it was with the meaning of love that the Creator of the universe sent himself – in the person of Jesus Christ – to dwell among humanity, to enjoy and to bear all the many seasons of life, and then to die upon a cross taking upon himself the sin of all of us. Forgiveness of humanity's wrongdoing came at a cost to God, but it came so that we might all know the meaning of love and the glory, not just of the rich autumn palette but, of life in all its freedom and fullness, living as forgiven people both in this world and the next.

My prayer for us all is that we might know God's fresh start of forgiveness in this new season whatever life is bringing right now, and that we might walk through the coming month (and beyond) free to notice the rich beauty of creation around us reminding us that each physical and metaphorical dying leaf can transform into a glorious flower.

School Corner

The end of the school year is always busy creating new memories, developing skills, having fun and saying goodbye to some of our friends.

Class 3 went on their residential to the Midlands. The children visited a mosque and football stadium in Wolverhampton before heading off to Ironbridge where they stayed at the Youth Hostel. The following day the children visited Blists Hill where they experienced Victorian life. To conclude the trip the children explored Mayan life at Cadbury's World. The children really enjoyed all of their experiences - thank you to the venues and all the staff for making the residential memorable and informative.

Back in school all classes have been enjoying Forest Schools sessions on our school field provided by Larks Foot. Children have been able to make new creations, set personal challenges and develop team work.

Class 1 went on two local trips. First, they visited Greenlands Farms where they met all the animals as well as had fun in the play barn. On their second trip they visited Morecambe beach. The weather was kind and the children spent the day playing on the sand.

Class 2 spent a wonderful day in the forest at Footprint in Windermere. The children spent the day exploring the woodland before learning more about the Stoneage; making fire, arrows and artwork.

The whole school took part in Sports Day. All the children worked together to earn team points completing throwing, jumping and running activities before taking part in the individual races of sack, egg and spoon and sprint. After a competitive and sporting afternoon, when all the points were added together, the house of Hutton, the reds, won! Well done to everyone.

Class 3 finished off their year with a trip to Grizedale Forest and Go Ape. All the children took part in a low ropes activity where they were able to personally challenge themselves through height and difficulty of obstacles.

Class 1 had a very busy end to the term where they held an exhibition of their work linked to their work on the Victorian Great Exhibition. Not only did they present their work but they also created and made a delicious menu including cakes, scones and sandwiches. Parents and friends of the school were then invited in to enjoy the fantastic food created by our youngest children.

Classes 2 and 3 also finished on a high following their performance of Peter Pan. All of our children were involved in roles within the production. It was wonderful to see children excel in confidence and self belief throughout rehearsals and in the final performances. Thank you to the Heron Theatre for allowing our children to perform in such a wonderful location.

On our final day of term, we said goodbye to Tim and Lucas. During the Leavers' Service we were treated to their memories of their time at our school as well as a display of their talents in keyboard and Taekwondo. We wish the boys success in their new schools.

We are now all looking forward to the new school year which will bring further amazing experiences, endless opportunities for learning and growth for every one of the children who attend our school.
