LINDA'S LETTER

DECEMBER 2015



The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness - on them light has shined... For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

Isaiah 9: 2&6

It can sometimes seem as if our modern society can promote some of the very worst of modern culture. After being repeatedly told to head for the shops to bag a bargain on *Black Friday*; the last Friday before Christmas has now earned the title of '*Mad Friday*' because this is the night when A&E units up and down the country are overwhelmed by the excesses of office and other Christmas party revellers.

The church keeps the month of December as a season of reflective preparation for the Birth of Christ. And yet even here there is little doubt what most of us will be doing over the next four weeks. The Christmas rush is on to get everything ready: cards written, gifts bought and sent, the preparation of food, plans about whose turn it is to go visiting who, and anxieties about who will be included in our festivities... There's a hint of panic in the air – will we ever be ready in time to celebrate Christmas!

But in just over four weeks it will all be over, in five weeks a New Year will have been welcomed in offering us another set of resolutions, in six weeks time the decorations will have come down, the furniture of life will be back in place, and we will be back to – well back to what? Will life be just the same, or will we be **changed?** If we take Advent seriously, I hope we certainly will be changed, because we shall have had the opportunity to reflect again on what it means to say that God came into the world in great humility being content to be born as a babe in Bethlehem, and that he still comes into the world - in all its mess and pain and joy, longing for us to recognise him. Advent is a godsend, a gift which should stop us in our tracks.

In this season of preparation there are certain themes which keep reappearing, they are there in our Scripture readings: Repent, be ready, keep awake, live in the light, He comes! Advent reminds us that not only do we live in two worlds, the one that appears to be going mad all around us, and the one that lives by God's kingdom values, but that we operate in two different time scales, in chronological time, and time beyond it.

And the point of intersection is **now.** As the Prayer Book Collects for Advent remind us *now* is the time when we have to cast away the works of darkness, and put on the armour of light. Now is our salvation nearer than when we first believed. **Repent.** Gosh - now that's not a word we use much nowadays, but there are few words that better express the message at the heart of the Gospel. Maybe we think we have no need to change, maybe there is nothing in us that we need to repent of, maybe we think we're OK just as we are – only you can examine your heart and discern whether or not you're in a state of grace, whether or not you're at one with God, whether or not you love your neighbour as yourself.

Advent should remind us that whatever else we have to do, there are only so many repenting days left to Christmas. The world is saying, 'Get on with it – don't wait for Christmas to hold the celebrations.' Advent says. 'Wait, be still, alert and expectant, and live by Christ's light.' We are celebrating God becoming involved in our world in Jesus Christ, and God invites us to make time for him. Remembering the God who comes to us every day, and longs for us to respond to him with our love, and that is something worth waiting for. Emmanuel!





The Moon smiled and went on her way. The children carried on singing and when they sang 'the stars in the bright sky' they too smiled, because they knew that the Moon had been there all the time


Christmas Quiz




