





## **Letter from the Curate**

#### Be different!

If you're reading this on the morning of 1st April, I'm here to remind you to be alert for the jokers and pranksters who like to come out to play on this day of the year! It can be a time for great hilarity, but it doesn't always end in laughs. One famous April Fool was played by the BBC back in 1980 when they announced that Big Ben was getting a makeover – it was going to go digital with beeps instead of bongs and be renamed Digital Dave. Plenty of people got the joke, but there were also plenty of people who didn't and who rang in to the BBC to express their outrage!



We might think that April Fool's Day is a relatively new tradition perhaps thought up by some joke shop owner! However, it's actually been around a long time and originates in the Church. There is some discrepancy over exactly how it came about, but it supposedly had to do with Christians being classed as 'fools for Christ' in the lead up to Holy Week and Easter.

In this season of Lent, Christians spiritually journey through the wilderness towards the cross of Good Friday (and beyond) with Jesus. It was on that cross that Jesus experienced the climax of the mockery and humiliation that had been building as he lived out the message of love that God sent him to share. So much of what Jesus did and said went against the cultural and societal norms of the day, for which he was challenged and ridiculed. Yet, he was simply trying to communicate a better way – the way – of living.

As Christians continue to follow Christ today, they, too, can be met with ridicule and humiliation – accused of acting as fools (fools for Christ). However, there's encouragement found in the Bible to persevere through this. In the words of St Paul:

For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. (1 Corinthians 1:18)

The Christian way of life may well lead people to look foolish – to do things that the world would say is odd. Would the 'world' encourage us to give away all our money to the poor? Would the 'world' encourage us to forgive people who hurt us and not take revenge? Would the 'world' encourage us to love our enemies? It's about going against the grain in order to follow the teachings of Christ.

Whether we do this from a faith standpoint or not, going against the grain can be very freeing. It's always good to question what our cultural and societal norms are asking of us, and to see whether or not we actually believe in them. So let's be wary – not only of practical jokers – but of 'following the crowd' without thinking. Let's be different! Let's be foolish?!

To end, let's turn to more words from St Paul, found in the letter he wrote to the Romans:

Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by

the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is – his good, pleasing and perfect will. (Romans 12.2)

I hope the rest of this Lent is filled with foolishness!

The running of our church relies on a large group of volunteers working together in enthusiastic teams.


The many different roles are interesting and varied, so would you like to join us?

#### The Sound of Music

As the well known film celebrates it's 60th anniversary this week, we only need to look at this edition of 'The Gateway' to see how vibrant the sound of music continues to be in our area - from Joanna Forbes L'Estrange's *The Season to Sing* on the front page, our school taking part in Young Voices, and Tess's regular Beetham Band update, to The Heron Theatre music and the many choral concerts coming up over the next few weeks

Our own church organist and choir director, Geoff Field, will be leading one of the Kendal celebrations for the 450th Anniversary of the granting of the town's first Royal Charter. Geoff, who is the music director of Kendal South Choir, is taking on the challenge of conducting four South Lakeland choirs in a collaboration for a spectacular performance of Carl Orff's Carmina Burana at Kendal Parish Church on Saturday 10th May

Choir members from across our Deanery will be amongst over 100 voices for the event, combining Kendal South Choir, Amabile, Poco Amabile, and FELLas men's community choir plus individual singers. They will be joined by three soloists, two pianists, and a battery of percussion that will raise the roof of Kendal Parish Church. The performers will each present showcase pieces in the first half, then everyone joins together in the second half of the evening for *Carmina Burana*, starting and finishing with the well-known and powerful 'O Fortuna'



The Kendal Royal Charter was bestowed by Elizabeth I in 1575, giving the town the right to an Alderman - which later became the position of Mayor — in a tradition continued to this day. We are grateful to Kendal Town Council for their generous grant to enable this performance of *Carmina Burana* to take place. Tickets are available from Ticketsource, and their charity referral programme means that for

Young Voices is a choir of up to 9,000 children who sing a variety of songs in large arenas. This year our Class 3 children went to the Co-op Arena, Manchester to perform alongside 7,000 other primary aged children and a live band. It was an amazing experience to be part of and was really enjoyed by all. Thank you to the parents who travelled down to be part of the audience and the teachers and pupils who worked really hard to learn all the songs.

Since half term we have welcomed Maya in to school on a Thursday. Maya plays Lacrosse for Great Britain and is running a lunchtime club as well as curriculum sessions for the children in Classes 2 and 3. All the children are really enthused by Lacrosse and are really enjoying the sessions.

On World Book Day children in Classes 1 and 2 visited Lancaster Grand Theatre to see the performance of Pirates love underpants. This really helped the children with words coming to life. The children really enjoyed their visit.

Class 1 have visited Morecambe Library this month. They were able to become members of the library and select books to take home. Andrew, the librarian, also read stories for the children to enjoy.

Class 3 took part in the RAF Glider Challenge. Children joined a live stream where they learnt about the forces at work on a glider. Following this they designed three of their own gliders to test which would travel the furthest. The children had a great time testing the flight of their gliders with the best designs being put forward to enter the STEM RAF competition.

#### Curriculum Focus: Religious Education (RE).

Beetham CE Primary School is part of Carlisle Diocese and as such we follow their guidance and use a scheme of work called Questful RE. This scheme teaches Christian concepts alongside God's big salvation story as well as explore all major World Faiths and discussion of non-religious worldviews.

Questful RE uses an enquiry approach where pupils are given a sense of being on a quest of discovery. Each unit of learning involves key questions which children spend time investigating, reflecting, evaluating and making meaning to be able to draw conclusions and answers. This approach encourages children to discover more about themselves, their relationship with others, their relationship with the world around them and their relationship with God.

Children learn yearly about the key event of Christmas and Easter alongside other topics including The Bible, Baptism, Harvest and The Church. Activities include watching videos, reading texts and visiting places of significance to their learning. Within each key question children are given the opportunity to explore the beliefs of Christians and other world faiths to allow an outward view of the world.

Later in the month, a group of us again enjoyed a session of Pickle Ball with our members, Lynn &

Our Noticeboard has spent the winter 'drying out' and being refurbished and will soon be fixed back on the wall near Beetham's Old Post Office (minus the fungi that had covered it's back)!

For our next monthly meeting we will be in The Wheatsheaf on Thursday 10th April from 2 to 4 pm, when we are holding a 'Book Social' where some members will chat briefly about their favourite




