Christmas Season 'Alleluia' - As we conclude our journey through the Epiphany season we sing the 'Alleluias' either side of the Gospel Reading for one last time (until Easter) this morning.

A Prayer for the new Archbishop of Canterbury - Earlier this week, Dame Sarah Mullally was duly confirmed in her election as the 106th Archbishop of Canterbury (ahead of her service of installation and welcome in March) and is thus now duly and legally the Archbishop and Primate of All England. We pray for Archbishop Sarah, for the Church of England and for the Anglican Communion, as her ministry now begins.
