

The Joy of Spring

Spring is just around the corner and that fact alone makes me feel blessed. I have been feeling more hopeful about the coming of spring since the winter solstice which occurred on the 21st December. That may surprise some people but for me the winter solstice is the turning point. By mid-January, the daily increase in light was around 2 minutes a day. By the 20th of February, daylight increased to 3 minutes per day - that's 21 minutes a week and growing! You may have realised that I'm not a fan of winter. I'm not a fan of short cold days and long dark nights with its accompanying negative impact on mood and sense of well being. However, the shortest day and the longest night have come and gone and now the days are getting longer and spring has, in my mind anyway, indeed sprung.

I haven't met anyone who says they don't like spring, it would seem that we all love spring. The joy of spring represents a vibrant season of renewal, marking the end of winter. The longer days, warmer temperatures, and the energy flooding into growth tends to boost our mood and sense of well-being. By embracing the joys of spring, we feel uplifted and more connected to the world around us so it begs the question, why do we feel so much better?

Could it be that our feelings of well being are linked to the increasing length of daylight, which has positive psychological and physiological effects. Waking up to bird song, seeing the sight of the sun shining through the window, feeling the sensation of the sun's warmth on our faces can be hugely uplifting, evoking positivity, energy and hopefulness, all things that easily desert us through the darker months. The winter tendencies towards lethargy and an animal desire to hibernate are swept away by a dynamic energy. Spring is prompting us humans to awaken and blossom just like nature is doing all around us.

You've probably noticed that it's a been a great year for snowdrops. You only have to look in the churchyard of St. Michael & All Angels, Beetham, to see solid evidence of that. I've a great admiration for snowdrops because when those courageous green shoots emerge, defying the winter weather, you know you've survived the darkest ten weeks, and you have the promise of lengthening days stretching ahead. We are also in for a treat as the daffodils and crocus make their splendid entrance. Again there is a promise of a bumper year judging by the number of flowers waiting to come out in the churchyard.

For me, spring is all about hopefulness, a state of mind that can easily elude us at the moment. Much is happening in our world to worry and concern us and so it's imperative that we watch and listen to Mother Nature as she orchestrates the most beautiful symphony of hopefulness. Being hopeful reduces the power of worry. When we have hope we develop and nurture a belief that the future can and will be better, and that we can be instrumental in making it so. Hope is three dimensional, it looks towards a better future, it's grounded in the past and the lessons learned and it's sustained in the present by a positive mind set.

So this spring, let us embrace the message of hope, allowing it to renew our spirits and strengthen our resolve. As we tend to our gardens and watch the flowers start to bloom let us embrace spring with open arms and a thankful heart and enjoy every last second of this glorious season.

Letter from The Revd Andrew Norman

Dear friends,

By the time you will be reading this the season of Lent, the annual forty-day (or so) period leading up to the joys of Easter will be well and truly established. That moment in the church's year given over to prayer, penitence, reflection and self-examination, the season which perhaps more than any other seems increasingly counter-cultural (but ever more needed) in our contemporary world, not least because it encourages all of us – whoever we are – to look closely at ourselves.

To look at oneself, one's life, one's words and one's actions is not always a very easy thing to do, because – as we all know well - to place ourselves under scrutiny does not necessarily bring us comfort or contentment. For it means that we have to let go of the excuses that we so easily (and conveniently) make for our lapses of judgement, or our failures to show kindness and consideration to others and so come face-to-face and consider not only the wrong we have done, but the good we so often fail to do.

In short, Lent is the invitation to turn the spotlight on ourselves, to examine our motives, intentions, deeds and desires both prayerfully and carefully. Not as an exercise in proving to ourselves how much we fall short, but rather as an exercise in revealing to us afresh how much we all stand in need of God's grace, mercy and forgiveness. We know this, because as Jesus himself discovered during his days of testing and temptation in the desert, we do not journey into the wilderness moments of life alone or indeed in our own strength. Rather we walk into them, and through them, assured of the Lord's goodness and faithfulness to us, those truths that provide the necessary scaffolding and support for us to be able to look at our lives honestly.

Understood in this way, it might be said that the days of Lent give us the space and occasion – whoever we are, whatever life might have looked like in the past, and wherever the future make take us – to start anew and begin again. An attitude and perspective which arises most authentically and truthfully when we look at our lives not in isolation, but in company with God, the one who in Jesus Christ has assured us of his proximity and presence. As the Irish poet, Brendan Kennelly, once wrote:

*'Though we live in a world that dreams of ending
that always seems about to give in
something that will not acknowledge conclusion
insists that we forever begin.'*

Our lives begin. And our lives end. Each is beautiful. Each is fragile. And each, in its own way, is miraculous. This time of the year invites us to consider our ending and our beginning and look forward to the abundance of spring, and, for those of us who follow Jesus, the abundance of life that his dying and rising bring to the world.

To quote another poet, Christina Rossetti, in her poem 'Lent':

*'It is good to be last not first,
Pending the present distress;
It is good to hunger and thirst,
So it be for righteousness.
It is good to spend and be spent,
It is good to watch and to pray:
Life and Death make a goodly Lent
So it leads us to Easter Day.'*

Bugs, freezing fingers, new musical pieces.... Ahh but we all love a little challenge as the rewards far outweigh any playing niggles, do we not?


You know how passionate I am about having music in our lives. I think we need it so much at the moment. A time to switch off the day to day intrusive babble and reset ourselves.



School Corner

It has been another wonderfully busy and exciting time in school, filled with hands-on learning, creative projects and memorable experiences across all classes.

Class 3 have continued their Geography work through the Blue Influencers project, learning about the living things that make Morecambe Bay such a unique local environment and how we can help protect them. The children recently visited the beach at Morecambe, taking part in practical fieldwork led by Laura Roper and funded by the Blue Influencers project. They explored the shoreline, identified coastal wildlife and discovered how small actions can help care for our bay. It was an inspiring morning that brought their classroom learning to life.

In Design and Technology, Class 3 have also been learning about pulleys, gears and levers. After investigating how these mechanisms work, the children applied their knowledge by designing and making their own theatre boxes. Each box featured changing scenery and moving characters, operated through the mechanisms they had constructed. The results were imaginative, skilful and wonderfully creative.

Class 2 have been diving into their topic on the Ancient Egyptians. They particularly enjoyed learning about mummification in the form of "Teddykhamun", to help them understand the process in a fun and memorable way!

Linking history with science, the class have also been investigating magnets and used what they learned to design and build their own pyramids with magnet controlled opening doors. This project was a brilliant blend of creativity, problem-solving and cross curricular learning.

Our lunchtime dance club have been working incredibly hard, and their efforts were rewarded with a fantastic performance at Ulverston Victoria High School (UVHS). The children's enthusiasm, teamwork and confidence were clear to see—they were absolutely amazing. A huge well done to everyone involved.

Class 2 had a great time at the gymnastics festival at Dallam School, where they explored a range of different equipment and movements. The children returned full of excitement and pride in their achievements.

All children enjoyed the Valentine's Disco, organised by FOBS. It was a joyful evening of dancing, and fun. Thank you to everyone who helped make the event such a success.

Class 1 enjoyed a lovely visit to Tesco, where they put their learning about shopping and instructions into practice. After writing their shopping lists in class, they visited the store to buy the ingredients they needed. Back at school, they used their purchases to make cakes—a highlight for everyone involved!

What would you do?

Foundation Governors, like all the other governors, help to develop a vision and strategy for the school. They oversee how the school spends its money and make sure the Headteacher is doing their job. Foundation Governors are appointed by the foundation that has a close connection to the school. At Beetham, this is the Church of England. Foundation Governors ensure that the school's foundational vision and ethos is maintained and enabled to flourish.

What is the commitment?

Governors meet for a couple of hours in the late afternoon around 6 times throughout the year. Governors also regularly undertake monitoring visits in school, having opportunity to learn more about different parts of school life and so report on these for the benefit of the whole Governing Body.

Who can do it?




